The Overview

Fleetwood waste water treatment is owned and operated by United Utilities and serves a catchment population of 248,000 as well as numerous visitors to the local area and the numerous tourist attractions, to a population equivalent to 321,000 which is forecast to rise to 427,000 by 2016. This has resulted in the need for investment in new processes to ensure consistent standards in waste water treatment.

The Challenge

Our role was to ensure that the buildings were delivered to standard and on time, to enable the processes to follow suit, on what would be a challenging and demanding critical path. The purpose of the supply and demand project was to enhance the treatment capacity of the works, for the increase in load due to the popular growth. The project provided the sludge treatment, storage and loading facilities needed to export sludge cake from Fleetwood.

The Solution

This project was a joint venture, delivered by an integrated team including United Utilities and KMI+ (Kier, Murphy and Interserve), to whom Gallaway were subcontracted, whose responsibility it was to deliver the implementation and handover phases. We were primarily responsible for the construction of three buildings on this site, namely the truck loading, grit skip and sludge treatment buildings. This included the structural steelwork, cladding, masonry works, gantry crane, fenestration and internal fit out.
